Road Diversion

All residents should have recently received a letter from McPhillips, the civil engineering contractor here at Lightmoor Village, advising of a road diversion to Stocking Park (Oakham Manor) via the Village Centre.

Sadly we do not have a firm date for the start of these improvements but the map below is intended to inform you of the re routing. Any further information will be sent out as soon as we receive it your contact is Jason on 504390

The letter states that vehicular traffic *“will be diverted via Lightmoor Way and the Principle Street”*. To avoid any confusion of where these roads are, please see the diagram below which illustrates the diversion clearly.

Purple shows the existing route into Stocking Park and Orange indicates the diverted route via the future Village Centre.

Please note that this diversion is for access to Stocking Park and vehicles only, pedestrians can continue to use Stocking Park Way as normal.

Car Parking

A reminder to all residents and visitors regarding car parking.

In order to utilise space in the courtyard areas and the development as a whole, please be courteous to other residents and road users by ensuring that all vehicles are parked correctly within the designated parking bays or garages only. Each property has been allocated provision for parking at least one vehicle.
