Street lighting is a thorny issue in that the Trust is responsible for only some of the lamps which we have a good record in maintaining.

In response to Mr. Singleton's letter and, indeed, other letters concerning the maintenance of the estate, BVT Chief Executive, Peter Roach, outlines the Trust's responsibilities in this issue's viewpoint 'The Way I See It', on page 9.

“ The description of the vast majority of Street Lamp standards across the Bournville, Kings Norton and Selly Oak Council Wards can only be described as pitiful, shameful and neglected.

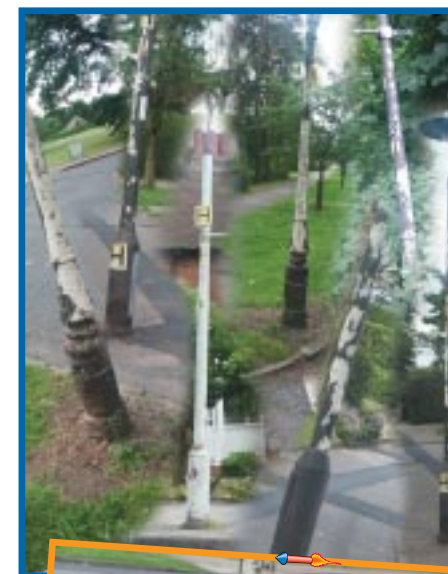
Despite ever increasing Community Charge Rates, and the fact that the area is a designated Conservation Area, there seems little interest, willingness or resolution to find a means of targeting any funds to resolve this situation.

I feel it is time to draw this issue to the attention of all involved parties.

We have been given advice from Council Lamp Standard Refurbishment department and the Council Conservation Office and that is to collect local Public Support.

I therefore urge you to report all dangerous or neglected lamp standards by letter or email to the Council or telephone them on 0121 303 9944 regarding the lamps where you live.
