CARE Patron HRH Princess Alexandra has officially opened Beech Spinney - the CARE Ironbridge residential and respite centre for adults with severe and multiple learning difficulties - in Telford.

The £1.3m development is a much-needed resource for local people with severe disabilities as well as an exciting and encouraging illustration of the success of partnership working in the Borough.

It was achieved through the combined efforts of the Borough of Telford & Wrekin, CARE (Cottage And Rural Enterprises Ltd - the care provider), Telford & Wrekin Primary Care Trust and BVT.

"Purpose-built Beech Spinney is a major investment for the area and incorporates the highest quality facilities to meet the needs of disabled adults in Telford & Wrekin," BVT Shropshire Area Manager, Kevin Whitby, told Outlook.
