

Youth service in Birmingham.

The standard you can expect from us.

We provide opportunities to young people to be heard and help shape our services. We manage a supported housing project for young people aged 16 – 18 who have been in local authority care, equipping them with the skills, confidence and resilience for fully independent living. We also support local organisations that work with young people, give local families access to events and develop work experience opportunities.



Youth services

- Provide opportunities to young people to have their voice heard through online discussions on specific topics or structured engagement opportunities.
- Signpost young people to other local organisations and partners.
- Work with BVT's Community Services team which leads on resident involvement and community development, including supporting a wide range of focus groups and activities.



Supported housing for care leavers

- Provide homes to young people aged 16 – 18 who have been in local authority care that are well-maintained and repaired.
- Offer support tailored to a young person's individual needs.
- Work with other agencies and individuals that support young care leavers.
- Provide a dedicated BVT staff team for our supported housing project.



How will we make sure we are doing what we say?

- Work with our local partners, including those that operate community facilities owned by us, to make sure there is a wide range of youth specific services available locally.
- Ensure our resident engagement strategies include young people, giving them the opportunity to help shape future service delivery and set priorities for us.



How will we share how we are doing with you?

- Encourage young people to use the opportunities available to let us know what they think we should be doing, what is important and any concerns.
